


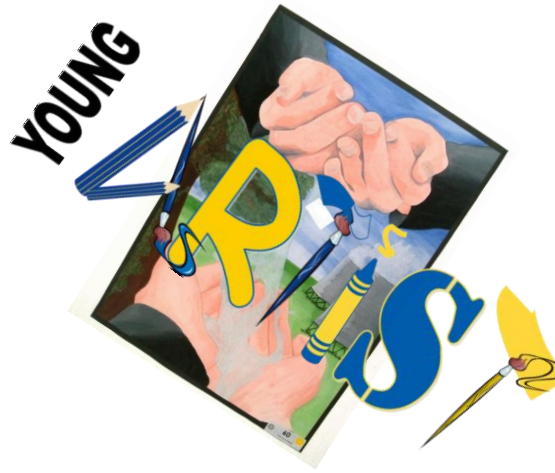

Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland has adopted this statement of policy in working with children, the vulnerable and those with disability.

The needs and rights of the child, the elderly, the vulnerable and those with disability take priority. It is the duty of every Rotarian to safeguard to the best of their ability the welfare of and prevent the physical, sexual or emotional abuse and neglect of all children, the elderly, persons with disability or otherwise vulnerable persons with whom they come into contact during their Rotarian duties.

CALLING ALL YOUNG ARTISTS

This competition encourages young people to express their interpretation of a given theme through their artistic skills, imagination and creativity.

Art is a means of self-expression irrespective of academic ability and the competition may therefore appeal to a wide spectrum of young people.

The competition is an opportunity for Rotary to promote art in the local community. Organised entries are much welcomed from schools and youth organisations in the area but youngsters can enter independently if they so wish.

There are three age categories, with ages taken on 31 August.

Junior	Aged 7 – 10 years
Intermediate	Aged 11 – 13 years
Senior	Aged 14 – 17 years

Consequently, at the time of the competition, in the Junior section some entries may be aged 11, in the Intermediate 14 and in the Senior 18.

entrants must depict:**

**“The event that made a
difference to my life/their lives”**

Entrants are asked to submit one picture using the artistic material of their choice e.g. water colour, pencil, charcoal, pastels, collage, acrylic or oil paint.

Pictures should be no larger than A1 size (594mm xc 841mm) and can be on paper or canvas.

Each entrant must give a title to their artwork and may, if they wish, provide a description of no more than 50 words for their inspiration and how they have chosen to reflect the theme.

The theme implies an event which has altered (for good or bad) the course of someone’s life. The range of possibilities is very wide. Here are a few examples out of many:

Significant war or peace events; scientific, technological or medical discoveries; a sporting occasion; landing on the moon; environmental projects, bad weather; a revelation about yourself or something; inspiring great literature.

Entries will be judged on

- ✚ Imagination
- ✚ Content
- ✚ Interpretation

Entrants

This competition is open to young people in the age groups shown who are entered into a competition run by their local Rotary Club. The local Rotary club will forward winning entries into a District competition and District winners may possibly be entered into a Regional Competition.

The winning artwork will remain the property of the artist, though it may be displayed in the ‘Rotary Today’ magazine and shown on the RIBI web site stating the winner’s age group.

Certificates & Awards

All entrants will receive a certificate and local prizes are at the discretion of the local Rotary Club. Winners of District or Regional competitions will be awarded appropriate prizes.
