# CALLING YOUNG SNAPPERS

(Students must be aged 7-18 to enter)

## Prepare to point, shoot and enter the D1040 Young Photographer competition

District 1040 Rotary Young Photographer provides an excellent opportunity for Rotary Clubs to offer young people the opportunity to channel this activity and use their imagination in a thought provoking and productive way and receive recognition for their effort and achievement. Cost is minimal and the key is participation and expression rather than technical capability.

❖ **The competition is aimed at attracting as wide a range of participation as possible (irrespective of access to technical equipment) and providing a sense of recognition and achievement for all participants by creating distinctive and imaginative images based on the theme. Entries should be original, unedited single images (i.e. not collages or composites) taken by the entrants themselves.**

**Aim is to encourage young people to:**

❖ **Experiment with photography.**

- ❖ Use either digital or traditional methods of photography.
- ❖ Show interpretation of a given topic

### Key Points

Opportunity for clubs to engage youth in their locality and participate in local/ district / national Rotary competition

Objectives to encourage young people to use photography to;

### Task for 2013-14

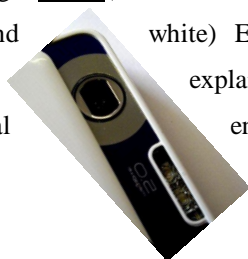
To produce a portfolio of three photographs of people, in colour or black and white on photographic paper.

### Express their ideas

(NB it's about the image not the equipment and images should be single, unedited images i.e. not collages or photo shopped pictures)

Three age groups (taken as at 31st August in year of competition - Junior (7-10) - Intermediate (11-13) - Senior (14-17)

Entries to be a single print (no more than A4 size and either colour or black and white) Each entrant to write up to 50 words explaining what inspired them, an official entry form required for each entry



### Competition

Club Competition; To be completed by 1st March in year of competition (i.e. winning entries for all age groups to be submitted to District organiser by this date)

District competition; completed by 1st April and results communicated to all participating clubs

### Suggestions for clubs

Decide on pool of potential entrants (one school v a number of schools/ youth organisations). Talk to school(s)/ Youth Group(s) offer point of reference in club provide support (e.g. publicity material, printing facilities for competition entries)

Liaise with District Co-ordinator on progress of local competition

Organise entry procedures; supply of entry forms details of club



/schools contact for submission. Organise judging panel / date (and communication back to school of results) in time to ensure winning entries reach District Organiser within timescales (see Dates and Process slide above). Give feedback to schools and competition winners.

Winners (plus highly commended if appropriate) visit clubs to talk about their entries, receive prize from clubs. Provide feedback and ideas for improvement next time around to feed in to District co-ordinator
