The needs and rights of the child, the elderly, the vulnerable and those with disability take priority. It is the duty of every Rotarian to safeguard to the best of their ability the welfare of and prevent the physical, sexual or emotional abuse and neglect of all children, the elderly, persons with disability or otherwise vulnerable persons with whom they come into contact during their Rotarian duties.

AIMS:

To deliver leadership development for young people who have the potential to be future Leaders in Business and the Community.



TO DEVELOP:

- Leadership skills
- Sense of pride and achievement
- The individual as a useful member of society
- The importance of teamwork, competition, character, health and tolerance



RYLA is an annual course held in a rural setting at a purpose built activity centre. There are two courses, the first running from last week in July and first full week in with a total of 64 places, 32 on each course. Full sponsorship is available through your local York Rotary Clubs

The RYLA course is open to young men and women who have passed their 16th. Birthday, but before their 18th birthday by the end of the course. They should be in full time education or vocational training courses or be apprenticed in a local industry.

The course contains a mixture of:

Physical and Mental Challenges that allow participants to experience Leadership, Team Building, Communication and Problem Solving skills.

These are based on both indoor and outdoor activities such as: -

Walking – Problem Solving – Water Activities – Orienteering - Raft building – Presentations - etc

These activities are conducted by experienced professional instructors who have worked with Rotary for many years, along with Rotarian mentors.

Rotary Clubs to register their interest in sponsoring a RYLA Awardee by December 1st accompanied by payment for their proposed awarded(s). Places are allocated when the Secretary receives the application form and payment...

Circulation letters sent out to schools and youth organisations inviting nominations in January, subject to the number of awardees allocated to the sponsoring club from the RYLA Secretary. Aim to complete interviews before the Easter Break. Registrations to be with the RYLA Secretary by 31st March.
