“Sail training requires participants to confront many

demanding challenges, both physical and emotional. It is an activity that inspires self-confidence and the acceptance of personal responsibility, promotes an acceptance of others whatever their social or cultural backgrounds, and develops a willingness to take controlled risks. For most who undertake sail training on Tall Ships it is a positive life-changing experience.”

For many it is the first time that they have had to take on responsibility for their actions and their decisions.

equality, fairness and

respect for each other through gaining an understanding of their different needs and backgrounds.

“Many of the participants do not leave the city very often (or indeed ever), certainly have never been on a 70’-foot yacht and mostly have not cooked and taken responsibility for themselves and a group in this way ever before”

Since her launch in 1987, James Cook has taken over 12,00 young people to sea.
